This research studied how different authors interpreted social-political reality as linguistically formed, discursive reality. Authors examined were the following: Ludwig Wittgenstein, Carl Schmitt, Michel Foucault, Niklas Luhmann, Jürgen Habermas and Michael Mulkey. The communitarian approach and ethnomethodology as well as certain Hungarian traditions were also included. One essay was prepared about each of the above authors and scientific streams. The conclusion of the research is that these authors and streams have outlined a new possibility in interpreting politics, however, they have not fulfilled it.
